

Albert Fennar, a founding member of Kamoinge, was born in New York City in 1938, and worked as a Film/video editor for NBC News. Al is currently retired and living in Long Beach, California. He learned Photography in the late 1950's in Japan while serving a three-year tour of duty for the U.S. Air Force. Returning to the U.S. after being discharged, his first job was working at a photo lab, where he met other photographers, some became original members of Kamoinge.
